Purpose

The purpose of the Student Poster Competition is to:

- 1) Recognize students and give them the opportunity to:
 - Practice their visual, written, and oral communication skills in a professional/conference environment
 - Share their research/project work with students and faculty from other institutions
- 2) Improve the visibility of student project and research efforts
- 3) Recognize excellence in student projects
- 4) Promote the sharing and exchange of ideas about projects and undergraduate research with the members of the Section.

Poster Specifications

Posters should be mounted on 3' by 4' maximum sized poster boards. Students may use one poster per group. **ALL MATERIAL SHALL FIT ON THE POSTER BOARDS IN THE SPACE PROVIDED.**

Unless otherwise arranged, the poster board will be the only area for presenting student material. Any special requests (e.g. table-top display or laptop) need to be submitted in writing via email to the Poster Chair (Dr. Brian Thomas, thomasb@trine.edu) at least two weeks before the conference.

Logistics

Students should plan to register and set up their displays between 8 and 9 a.m. Saturday morning. They are required to be present during the student poster session, and posters must remain on display until the end of the last technical session. Awards will be announced and distributed after the end of the last technical session.

Student Registration and Cost

Students who participate in the poster competition will be expected to register for the conference. The student registration fee is \$25.00 per student. While students are encouraged to attend the entire conference, they are not required to stay for its entirety.

Awards

Awards will be given for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place overall and will be announced and distributed during the awards ceremony after the last technical session.
